#### **Honors Contract Process**

- 1. Read about Honors Contracts at the <a href="https://example.com/html/>
  HTP website.">HTP website.</a>
- 2. Think about the topic you want to research.
- 3. Ask a professor you are studying with if they would be willing to be your Honors Contract Faculty Professor.
- 4. Read about the <u>guidelines for Honors Research</u>
  <u>Proposals</u> (Step 1)
- 5. Write a one-paragraph Honors Research Proposal and get your professor's feedback.
- 6. Revise and refine the proposal.
- 7. Once your professor has approved the proposal, submit it to the HTP website by Oct. 2. Then keep your eye out for the proposal response.
- 8. Work on your research and the project described in the proposal with your professor throughout the semester.
- 9. Once your professor has approved your work, submit it to the HTP website (Step 2)
- Make sure your professor responds to the submission notification to confirm approval.






### Meet the Honors Student Ambassadors!


