

# Prompts for Questions to College Representatives

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## General Information

- Student enrollment at the University; percentage of transfer students.
- Quarter or semester system.
- Type of housing available; percentage of students who live on campus.
- After transfer, length of time it takes to earn a Bachelor Degree.
- Number of students attending full-time vs. part-time.

## Admission

- Applications for admission – Fall semester only, or also Spring semester (or Winter term).
- Cost of the application.
- Average GPA of admitted transfer students.
- For private universities, number of units required to apply.
- How does the university view students who have attended multiple campuses, including 4-year campuses.
- When applicants are notified of their admission.
- Percentage of transfer applicants admitted.

## Major:

- Find out if the University has your major. If yes, is it impacted (competitive)?
- Required GPA for the major that interests you.
- Importance of prerequisites (preparation courses) for your major.
- What are the popular majors at your University?
- Changing your major after transfer.
- Do you accept the Associate Degree for Transfer? If yes, what are the benefits?

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## Cost of Attendance

- Annual cost of attendance (tuition and fees).
- Available financial aid and scholarships.
- Percentage of students receiving financial aid.
- Percentage of students who work while attending school.
- Work opportunities on campus.

## Student Services

- Counseling Services
- Tutoring Services
- Disability Programs/Services
- AB540/Dream Act/EOPS/TRIO/MESA/Puente etc.
- Health Services
- Career/Job Placement Services

## Student Life

- Student clubs and organizations active on campus.
- Do you have any Division I or Division II sports teams?
- Exercise facilities that are on campus.
- Available food service: restaurants, cafes, meal plans, etc.
- What are the most popular activities for students, both on and off campus?
